



Rules Clarification/Rulebook Insert 2011 Edition Official Handbook of Rules and Regulations Effective Date: October 1, 2010

Application of the - 7 Did Not Perform Maneuver Score

Reference ParIVD.p.10, ParVE3.p.18,ParVF.p.21-23,ParV.2)p.25-27,ParV.3)p.27-28,ParVIIB.1.p.37.

NVRHA continues to strive toward achieving judging consistency at Schooling Competitions. Interpretation and use of the -7 Maneuver Score has varied among judges. To correct this interpretation, questions have been included on the Clinician Certification Test to get all judges scoring consistently. The test questions use the following interpretation.

The -7 Maneuver Score shall <u>only</u> be used when a maneuver is <u>not</u> attempted by the rider and if the maneuver is <u>not</u> attempted, certain penalties must also be applied. However, if a maneuver <u>is</u> attempted, the scoring scale of -3 to +3 shall be used based upon the quality of the execution of the maneuver.

Frequently Occurring Examples:

- Trail The rider approaches the log drag obstacle and rides past making no attempt to perform.
- A -7 Maneuver Score is marked
- A-10 Missed Pattern is marked (note, the -10 missed pattern penalty can
 only be awarded once during the trail class), however other major
 penalties of -10 may be incurred (Use of two hands with curb bit, More
 than one finger between the reins, Illegal or failed equipment).
 - Working Cow Horse The rider boxes the cow and makes no attempt to drive the
 cow down the fence and complete a turn in each direction
- A -7 Maneuver score is marked for the <u>first</u> turn.
- A -7 Maneuver Score is marked for the second turn.
- A penalty of -5 (Not getting one turn each way) is taken for the <u>first</u> turn
 and a penalty -5 (Not getting one turn each way) is taken for the <u>second</u>
 turn, resulting in a total of -10 penalty points for not attempting the
 maneuver.
- Roping The rider rates his cow, demonstrates his rope handling skills, but makes no attempt to catch and stop the cow.
- A -7 Maneuver Score is marked for the Stop Cow maneuver
- A penalty of -5 (no catch) and -5 (did not stop cow) is marked

Had the roper attempted to catch and stop the cow by throwing his rope, but missed:

- The -3 to +3 score scale will be used. At best, a -1 maneuver score could be awarded as the roper did not perform the maneuver correctly.
- A penalty of -5 (no catch) and -5 (did not stop cow) is marked

- Cutting The rider separates his cow from the herd, attempts the cutting maneuver but never pulls his turnback riders off resulting in no attempt to drive and pen
- A -7 maneuver score is marked for the drive maneuver with a -5 penalty for failure to drive the cow between the fence and the cone.
- A -7 maneuver score is marked for the penning cow maneuver with a -5 penalty for failure to pen.

Had the rider pulled his turn back riders off and attempted to drive the cow in the direction of the pen, the -3 to +3 score scale would have been used and a maneuver score awarded based upon the quality of the maneuver.


Intermediate "Box Only"—Limited Class RefParIXDp10 and ParXBp39.

Affiliates and New Start Events have the option of holding a "Box Only" Limited Division for more advanced intermediate and advanced riders (scores, all five classes, greater than 230) held separate from the traditional NoviceIntermediate/Advanced Divisions outlined in the Rulebook. This Division would not be eligible for either NVRHA Placement or Championship Points until such time as the criteria set forth in Par10B of the Rulebook has been satisfied. Affiliates may track points for Affiliate year end awards if desired and provide the results at year end for consideration of an NVRHA sanctioned Division in the following Event Year. The Working Ranch Score Sheets on pages 52, 54, and 56 would be utilized.

Rulebook Errors

Despite very careful reviews during publication, errors are inevitable. The following errors should be noted in your rulebook:

- Ref. Trail Pattern p.20—In the #10 Maneuver Add "Pick Up All Four Trails."
- Ref. All Working Ranch Score Sheets p. 52-57—Within the Scoring Scale Box, remove the Penalties sentence "A roper...no catch" in its entirety. This is more accurately explained in the Roping section of the Rulebook ParVG3) and in the above clarification of the Application of the -7 Maneuver Score.
 - Ref. Open Division ParVIIF2.p.34—End of Year awards will be awarded to the Open Rider.
- The Worlds Greatest Ranch Horse Competition may be held in conjunction with the National Championship or at a different location at a different time of year.
