
Arizona 2009 Season Opener

The second year of Versatility Ranch Horse in Arizona kicked off on Feb. 20-22 in Buckeye (just west of Phoenix). Forty two enthusiastic horse/rider teams rode during the three day event. Out of state teams traveled from Kansas, New Mexico, Colorado, Nevada, California, Alberta Canada and Minnesota to enjoy one of the most spectacular NVRHA events held to date. NVRHA President, Dave Currin, stated "This was the most enthusiastic group of talented riders that he had seen in his eight years of attendance at Ranch Horse events - - truly an extraordinary Ranch Horse experience!"

The event was organized and managed by Bob and Rebecca Grant of Camp Verde whose attention to each and every detail was key to its' success. One of NVRHA's Professional Advisors, Jay Henson, assisted by his wife Gena, another exceptional horsewoman conducted the Friday and Saturday clinics and Sunday Schooling Competition. The Henson's have become one of NVRHA's most popular clinicians

and judges - providing exceptional tutoring in all five Ranch Horse classes.

On Saturday night, nearly seventy participants and guests overwhelmed a local restaurant for an evening of camaraderie with the day's events the favorite subject of conversation. Despite the short kitchen staff for the much larger than expected crowd of diners, all departed anxious for the next day's schooling competition to begin.

On Sunday a beautiful sunrise started off another 70 degree day, with no wind the typical Arizona winter weather did not disappoint. The day's busy schedule of each rider shuffling between arenas to do a "test drive" in each of the five Ranch Horse classes was very smoothly conducted. Rene Lieffort's skilled announcing kept everyone well informed and moving efficiently from arena to arena. A very special thank you goes to the volunteers that share a passion for this event and made it successful. Patty Hamel and Chris Lytle faithfully served the judges all day as scribes. Lanie White took her job as "fix it girl" very seriously and helped Gena all afternoon in the trail class. Jim Heitel, Dave Pawel, Monty Soto and Ben Balow took turns managing the cattle while competing as well. Denise Eldred and Jennifer White hoofed it between arenas making sure everything was running smoothly and delivered score sheets to Doug Heyvaert, (all the way from Minnesota) the numbers guru who kept up with the extensive judge's sheets and scoring.

The Buckeye Event featured one of NVRHA's first Ranch Horse Open Jackpot Competitions and was well attended with eight horses. This Open event permits any horse, any rider, and any breed to participate. Many of the Open riders attended the earlier clinic. A wide variety of riders competed including professionals and ranch cowboys and the competition was tough.

At days end, handsome handmade buckles, crafted by Clint Mortenson of Santa Fe, N.M. were presented to Division All Around Winners. Professionals Choice SMB-3 boots were presented to Reserve All Around in each division. Winners were:



NVRHA RULE CHANGES EFFECTIVE 2009

- 1. Each participant's top four competition scores will be used to determine Division year-end winners.
- 2. Rider/horse combinations will remain in the same Division for the full year even if earning greater than 60 placement points, which would have previously elevated them to the next higher Division.
- A rider/horse must participate in a minimum of two competitions to be eligible to participate in the National Finals.
- 4. Intermediate and Advanced Divisions placement in Ranch Conformation will be based on "Form To Function" for Placement Points.
- An additional Riding Pattern has been added for the Ranch Riding Class.
- 6. A jackpotted Open Division (any horse, any rider) will be offered at selected events.
- 7. No Youth Division will be held at the National Finals in 2009 due to limited participation at events in 2008. In 2009, youth may participate in Amateur Divisions based on their established handicaps. 2010 offerings will be based on 2009 participation.

"Tell them what you're going to tell them - Tell them - Then tell them what you told them..." that's the standard formula for a scholarly presentation. It also seems like a good idea for presenting the explanation of the current changes to the NVRHA youth program.

Tell them what you are going to tell them, step one: The NVRHA is, always has been, and will continue to be committed to the development and inclusion of youth in the versatility ranch horse program.

Tell them, step two: Several issues were brought to the board's attention at the January meeting. Most notable was the lack of youth participation at the state events. Because of the requirement for a youth division at all NVRHA events, this became a cost/benefit issue. Complaints also came from parents concerned about the effort and expense of traveling to events where their child competed in a youth division against no one. After much thoughtful discussion the following decisions, effective immediately, were made:

1. Due to lack of youth participation in state events in 2008, no Youth Division will be held at the 2009 National Finals and no Youth year-end awards will be

offered.

- A Youth Division may be held at any state event at the discretion of the event manager.
- 3. A youth may choose to compete in a Youth Division (if offered) or in the appropriate Amateur Division at any event. Youth participants in the Amateur Division will be held to the same rules as adult amateurs.
- 4. All national points earned by youth will be awarded in the appropriate Amateur Division. States that choose to give youth year-end awards must keep their own youth points.
- A youth or amateur may ride a horse that they do not own in a clinic or schooling competition, however NVRHA points will not be awarded.
- Future national Youth Divisions and awards will be based on demonstrated participation and re-evaluated annually.

Tell them what you told them, step three: The NVRHA is, always has been, and will continue to be committed to the development and inclusion of youth in the versatility ranch horse program.

"Riding the Legend"

The American Ranch Horse



### THE RANCH HORSE

In the late 1800's and early 1900's as the American West was unfolding, a true legend, the American Ranch Horse, centered around the booming cattle industry, evolved. Through necessity, the Ranch Horse was the cowboy's pickup truck, tractor, four wheeler, and helicopter all rolled into one. This horse was ridden long distances over rough terrain for days, weeks, and months—gathering cattle for branding and doctoring, herding cattle to railheads, and providing transportation riding fence and going to town for supplies. Selective breeding over time resulted in a 'legendary' horse that was structurally sound with innate cow and athletic ability. conformed for the function that he was tasked to do day in and day out. Although today he has been replaced by modern machinery on most ranches, his amazing skills are being enjoyed by horsemen across the country doing the exact functions he was bred to perform.

### EXPERIENCING THE THRILL

Over the past seven years, a group of horseman dedicated to preserving, enjoying and educating the rider in all the functions of this 'legendary' horse evolved into the National Versatility Ranch Horse Association. Classes were designed duplicating as much as possible the tasks the traditional Ranch Horse was bred to perform. The foremost goal of NVRHA is to provide riders of all skill levels the opportunity to have fun riding the Ranch Horse while advancing their riding skills through education. The NVRHA follows the model developed by the American Quarter Horse Association focusing on Ranch Cutting, Working Ranch Horse (Reining,



Working Cow Horse and Roping), Ranch Riding, Ranch Trail, and Ranch Conformation. AQHA rules are followed except when changes are necessary for the safety of beginning riders, to lessen the impact of disqualification rule violations, and to provide more skill measurement in judged events.

The foundation of the NVRHA Ranch Horse program was developed over the past seven years based on information gleaned from nearly 200 events and over 3000 entries of 1200 plus horse/rider teams by a very active board of directors, all of whom ride the event. The result of this evolution is summarized in the paragraphs which follow.

### ACCURATE SKILL MEASUREMENT

The Achilles heel of practically all horse events is inaccurate and perceived unfair judging. Exhibitor frustration due to poor judging has destroyed the enthusiasm of many horsemen. The NVRHA's Point Based Scoring System has been lauded by many as the most fair and accurate in the industry. During the past seven years, very few complaints have been received. The NVRHA Point

### SCORING A RUN

(Ranch Cutting used as an example)

Each Class has a carefully developed score sheet which subdivides the class into maneuvers. Ranch Cutting is used for illustration.

### Ranch Cutting Maneuvers

As the exhibitor performs the class, the Judge will assign a Maneuver Score to each and every maneuver. The Maneuver score ranges from -3 (Very Poor) to +3 (Excellent) with a 0 awarded for a correct work.

### Maneuver Score Scale

+3 Excellent, +2 Very Good, +1Good, 0 Correct, -1 Needs Improvement, -2 Poor, -3 Very Poor

During the run, any action by the exhibitor or horse which would result in a penalty is recorded by the scribe as directed by the judge

### Typical Cutting Penalties

A typical run may result in the scores like the ones below:

### Maneuver Scores:

Herd Entry -1, Drive Cow From Herd 0, Setting Up For Cutting -2, Degree Of Difficulty +1, Courage/Cow Sense +1, Working Center Of Arena -2, Eye Appeal +1, Setting Up For Driving +2, Driving To Pen +2, Penning -3.

Penalties: Back Fence -3, Not Penning -5, Two Hands On Rein (Senior Horse) -20

The resulting Maneuver Scores would be: -1, 0, -2, +1, +1, -2, +1, +2, +2, -3 = -1

**Penalties:** -3, -5, -20 = -28

Cutting Run Score=

70(Basis Score)\* -1(Total of Maneuver Scores) -28(Total of Penalties)= 41

\*The Rider/Horse Team works from a Basis Score of 70

Note: The -20 penalty for using two hands on a senior horse would have resulted in a Run Score of 0 (Disqualification) at an AQHA Competition. The other three Ranch Horse performance classes (Working Ranch Horse, Ranch Riding, and Ranch Trail) are scored using the same procedure.

### Ranch Conformation

In Ranch Conformation, the Ranch Horse is judged based on "Form to Function".

Form (Structural Correctness and Balance) constitutes 60% of the 100 points and Function (as measured by the scores achieved in the four performance classes) constitutes the remaining 40%. This insures a well conformed horse must possess the heart, athletic ability, and trainability to place well in the Ranch Conformation class.

At the end of the Schooling Competition, the scores from each of the five classes are added together for the horse/riders total score.

The Total Event Score (284) is often referred to as the Horse/Rider Team HANDICAP.

The Point Base Scoring System is an extremely powerful tool. Some of its most valuable uses are:

- Feed back to Exhibitors: Score Sheets are typically provided to the exhibitor at the end of the day of the Schooling Competition and are used to monitor skill improvement.
- 2. <u>Division Placement</u>: As the Judge scores against a "Standard of Performance" regardless of rider skill level, the Total Event Score (Handicap) may be used for placing Horse/ Rider teams of similar skills into Divisions.

- 3. Rewarding Achievement: Points are awarded based on scores received as compared to others for both Year-End Awards and NVRHA Level of Achievement Awards.
- Judging Equity: The Judge only assigns maneuver scores and identifies penalties shown on the score sheets, then provides the

results to the office for tabulation which will determine the class winners. The Judge is distanced from the perception of bias toward any specific rider.

### DEVELOPING THE SKILL

With complete and accurate feedback at Schooling Competitions, exhibitors have the roadmap for developing skills needed to excel in all the Ranch Horse classes. Skills are developed by attending clinics, taking private lessons and practicing at home. Progress is measured by competing in another Schooling Competition and getting a new roadmap. It's a continuous cycle and horse/rider combinations can progress as far as their ambitions will take them.

To get started, riders need only attend a NVRHA clinic/schooling competition event. They are placed into a Division (either Novice, Intermediate of Advanced) by the event clinician. This initial Division assignment is based primarily on safety considerations. The score received in this initial Schooling Competition determines the Division placement in the second Schooling Competition. The average, of the first two competitions, result in a Division assignment for the remainder of the year.

### REWARDING ACHIEVEMENT

Fun is NVRHA's middle name and the Association places much emphasis on the fun associated with not only achieving, but celebrating success. Two award systems are used, one based on skill levels (Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced) in the form of year end awards and a second based on "level of achievement" where all horse/rider teams are compared against a "standard of excellence" (Ranch Horse Champion Awards).

### Year End Awards

The unique NVRHA Scoring System provides the opportunity to recognize superior achievement at all skill levels—Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced Amateur Riders as well as Novice and Advanced Youth. After Rider and Horse Teams are assigned to a Division, they remain in that Division all year. Their scores are tracked by NVRHA and yearend awards are presented to the rider/horse team with the highest scores at the September NVRHA National Finals held in Colorado Springs. State Affiliates often use these points for Year End State High Point Awards.

### Placement Points

Year End awards are based upon the number of Placement Points received in each of the five classes (Ranch Cutting, Working Ranch Horse, Ranch Trail, Ranch Riding and Ranch Conformation), within each Division (Advanced, Intermediate, and Novice Amateur Divisions and Advanced and Novice Youth Divisions). The number of Placement Points earned is based on the rider/horse team placing and the number of rider/horse teams that are in their class. (For instance, in a class of five rider/horse teams in Ranch Cutting, the winner receives five placement points; second place receives four, etc.). The placements points earned in each of the five classes are totaled for the TOTAL EVENT SCORE. The highest TOTAL EVENT SCORE from a team's best four events are added to determine the TOTAL YEAR SCORE. This TOTAL YEAR SCORE is compared to other rider/horse teams in each Division to determine the year end award winner.

### **NVRHA Champion Awards**

In addition to Year End awards, the NVRHA recognizes "Level of Achievement" of rider/horse teams using a system very similar to the AQHA Champion Award. For this award, the Run Scores from each rider/horse team for each of the five classes from all Divisions are ranked high to low. The top score receives points based on the total number of rider/horse teams competing (all divisions).

Points are awarded in accordance with the AQHA Point System—one point for each five horses competing. In this example Bar Doc would receive one Ranch Cutting point and Peppy Badger would receive  $\frac{1}{2}$  point. Larger classes would be awarded more points. Had there been ten horses, the winner would have received 2 points,  $2^{nd}$  place 1 point, and  $3^{rd}$  place  $\frac{1}{2}$  point.

### **NVRHA** Ranch Horse Champion

Rider/horse teams attaining five points in all five classes (Ranch Cutting, Working Ranch Horse, Ranch Trail, Ranch Riding and Ranch Conformation) earn this award. Over the past seven years, thirty five Ranch Horse Champions have been presented.

### **NVRHA Supreme Ranch Horse Champion**


Criteria for this award is the same as the Ranch Horse Champion, except, a total of ten points must be earned in each of the five classes. Fifteen Supreme Champions have been made over the past seven years.

### NVRHA Ranch Horse Performance Champion

The intent of this award is to recognize those horses that may never achieve ten points in conformation. Once a rider/horse team receives ten points in each performance class (Ranch Cutting, Working Ranch Horse, Ranch Trail and Ranch Riding) the rider/horse team is presented this award. This award and the Supreme Ranch Horse Award will not be given to the same rider/horse combination in the same year. Instead the higher (Supreme) of the two awards will be given.





# Southern Region Gears Up to Become Next NVRHA Affiliate

There is a lot of enthusiasm down south! And most of it is coming from an active group of folks in the states of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri, and Louisiana as a grassroots effort begins to take shape with hopes of forming a four state regional NVRHA affiliate. This growing group of NVRHA members is coming together under the leadership of Cathy Brownson, southern expansion chairperson, and has planned several first rate regional events for 2009. The contagious excitement for the sport of versatility ranch horse and specifically the mission and vision of the NVRHA, is sweeping these four states and opening up a whole new venue for ranch horse enthusiasts!

The NVRHA encourages affiliation as a means of expansion and attainment of organizational goals. There are established affiliation requirements described in detail in the official rules and regulations handbook. The following are key excerpts from the handbook regarding affiliation:

### A. General

NVRHA establishes strategic alliances with geographic regional groups and horse related organizations when it is beneficial for both organizations. Ranch Horse enthusiasts in specific states often form an organization dedicated to holding events to promote fun and advancement of horsemanship skills riding the stock horse performing the seven basic skills—cutting, riding, trail, and conformation. Established horse related organizations affiliate with NVRHA to enhance achievement of organization goals such as breeding, sales, product promotion, equine education, etc.

### **B.** Alliance Agreement

Upon determination by NVRHA and the potential affiliate that a strategic alliance is desirable by both organizations, a partnership agreement will be crafted which outlines common objections, working relations, and other key relationships. The Agreement must be agreed to by all key stakeholders and reviewed / amended on an annual basis.






